There are also some in which we renew our support to assure the continuance of those organizations.

Dear Brother Herman

Dear Brother Herman:

One of the most outstanding Masonic authors, lecturers, and reviewers is Alphonse Cerza of Chicago, Illinois. A noted lawyer by profession, he publishes Masonic articles and book reviews in a number of national magazines. One of these is in the monthly **Philalethes Magazine** under the title "Al Cerza reviews books of interest to Masons." In the current issue of the **Philalethes Magazine** he adds the following interesting item:

PERSONAL PUBLIC RELATIONS

Every Mason on occasion will have opportunities to engage in personal public relations provided that he is alert and acts when this takes place. Here is an illustration of how this can come about.

Recently I attended a Masonic meeting in another state and after the formal meeting one of the members present stated that he had served in World War Two and made the acquaintance of a young man from Chicago. He had lost track of this person over the years though they had become good friends and had corresponded for a long time after the war was over. He wondered if it was possible for me to make an attempt to locate his friend and I volunteered to try. On my return home I checked the Chicago telephone book and the name was not listed. I then checked all the phone books

covering the suburbs of Chicago and in one of them the name appeared. I called that person to be sure that he was the one I was seeking.

It turned out that he was exactly the person I was seeking and that for some years he also had hoped he could be in touch with his old friend. I asked if he was a Mason and he said that he was not. I then explained that the reason I had asked the question was that I had met his friend at a Masonic meeting in his state, that he had requested my help because I lived in the Chicago area. I then went on to explain that Freemasonry is a fraternity and that we teach our members to be of help to everyone whenever possible and that we take part in all kinds of worthy causes. He listened to what I had to say and thanked me for the explanation.

5. A revised parking lot contract, as discussed in the last

6. To date, 228 lovely people have contributed \$20,458. to the special fund drive. This is really a super response, but we must keep this drive moving!!

7. On the basis of loans from the member bodies, and the gratifying response to date on the special drive, the trustees voted, without a dissenting

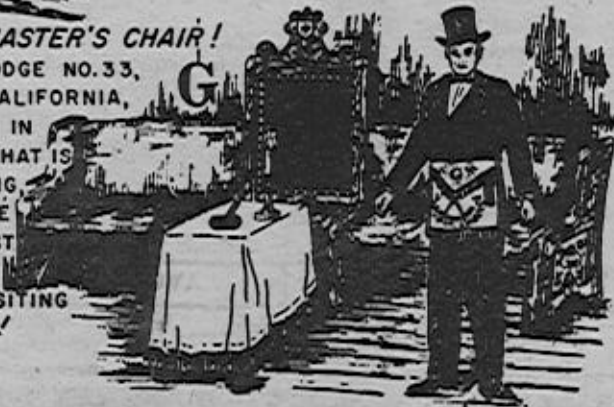
