Dear Brother Herman

Rt. Wor. Herman Sarachan will answer questions on Masonic ritual, symbolism, history and law. Address your questions to BROTHER HERMAN, c/o Masonic Service Bureau, 875 East Main Street, Rochester, New York 14605.

Q. What is the symbol on a 32nd degree ring, and what does it signify?

A. It is the Hebrew letter "Yod" and is the initial of the ineffable name of God, which we transliterate into English as "Jehovah." This word is never pronounced by Jews whenever it occurs in the Scriptures or the Prayerbook, but instead the word "Adonay" meaning "Lord" is substituted.

Q. I recently attended a Masonic Funeral Service, and felt very uncomfortable because the Master who officiated read the service poorly, mispronounced words, and must have left an unfavorable impression of Masonry on the many non-Masons present. Is it necessary for the

Master himself to read the service?

A. One of the few occasions when Masons conduct a ceremony in public is the Masonic Funeral Service. It is, therefore, of the utmost importance that the Service be read with dignity, with expression, and with meaning. The official Monitor, under "General Directions for Burial Service," (1939 edition) states it clearly: "The Worshipful Master of the Lodge is not under the duty personally to conduct the services. It is his duty to designate a brother to officiate, qualified to perform the rite in a manner in keeping with the dignity of Free-masonry, and the solemnity of the occasion." I can understand how strong the desire must be for the Master to appear in public as the officiant, but would urge every Master to follow the direction in our official Monitor, and select two or three competent brethren who can be called upon for the Service. It shoul

that no officers aprons or jewels are to be worn that no officers aprons or jewels are to be worn, that the arpon to be placed upon the casket shall be the white lambskin apron, never a Past Master or Grand Lodge apron, and that the apron is nevertied around the body.

Q. Is it permissible for a Master Mason who is a member of a Female organization, such as Eastern Star to participate in a raffle, lottery, or gambling enterprise

conducted by such organization?

A. In 1954, Grand Master Ward B. Arbury ruled in a similar case, as follows: "The 'Order of the Golden Chain' is composed of Master Masons and their immediate female relatives. . . indicating that so far as the male members are concerned, membership is conditioned upon membership in the Masonic Fraternity, within the language of the Edict of Most Wor. Jacob C. Klinck, dated December 31, 1936...The...Edict applies to the Order of the Golden Chain, and...since a raffle is merely a lottery, the Masonic members of the Order are laying themselves open to prosecution in Masonic disciplinary proceedings by permitting such action."



Masonry, however, is like life, in that you cannot get any more out of it than you put into it. The mere ceremony of becoming a Master Mason makes no man any better than he was before, but the earnest endeavor to live up to the beautiful teach ings of Masonry cannot help but make any man better. And so, my brethren, I look

forward to a bright, fruitful and inspiring year. With your help and God's, I know it will be so.

SERVICE CORNER

P. L. 88-664, effective Jan. 1, 1965, changes the Veterans Administration (Federal) Law relative to Veterans having Non-Service Connected Disability for those Veterans previously under P. L. 86-211 or eligible to being so classed.

This new change affect income allowance by exclusion of some hereto included in moneys counted.

The new changes exclude some income formerly included as income in the older law - P. L. 86-211, which will permit some veterans

to receive pensions for which they had been ineligible under the old law. Some incomes changed are profits realized from disposition of real or personal property, bonuses paid by some States, all earned income of the spouse or up to \$1200 of the spouse's other income. Also excludes 10% of any public or private retirement income, and other liberalized benefits. Included in the changes are some which permit the V.A. to provide drugs and medicines prescribed by a duly licensed physician for veterans receiving disablity pension at the increased rate for aide and attendance.

New schedules for amount of pension is also effective. Also recent amendments liberalizing educational benefits of totally disabled living veterans children have allowed in some cases up to 36 months of education.

Veteran Administration Service Officers or the Service Officers of the Veteran Organization Groups are able and willing to guide all interested parties in their efforts to determine their eligibility under all Public Laws relative to Veterans.
