## SHRINE CIRCUS FEB. 9-10-11-12

### HILFIKER SHOW EARLIER THIS YEAR - FEBRUARY 26

February 26th is the date of the annual Hilfiker show at the Auditorium Theater. On March 1st Brother Earl will be in Dallas, Texas to begin a two month tour of personal appearances, radio and Television interviews in the Southwest and Deep South.

Earl's new film CANYON COUNTRY has the most spectacular scenic settings of any of his productions to date. He made three extend-

ed trips to the Southwest to get his material. He captured the scenic splendors of Bryce Canyon and Zion Canyon and the awesome majesty of Grand Canyon. He filmed the Navajos herding their sheep and weaving their rugs against the backdrop of Monument Valley. He lived among the Havasupi Indians, the people who dwell in splendid isolation in the bottom of Grand Canyon along the blue waters and spectacular waterfalls of Havasu Creek.

The wildlife subjects run the gamut from dwellers of the Lower Sonoran Desert, the jack rabbit, javalina and Gambel's quail to the Canadian forms found on the North Rim of Grand Canyon, the bighorn sheep, mule deer, ground squirrels, marmots and especially the rare and beautiful black bodied squirrel with the tufted ears and white tail, the Kaibab squirrel that lives only among the ponderosa pines on the Kaibab Peninsula of the North Rim.

Again, this show is sponsored by Union Star Lodge No. 320 of Honeoye Falls, New York for the benefit of our Monroe County Masonic Service Bureau.

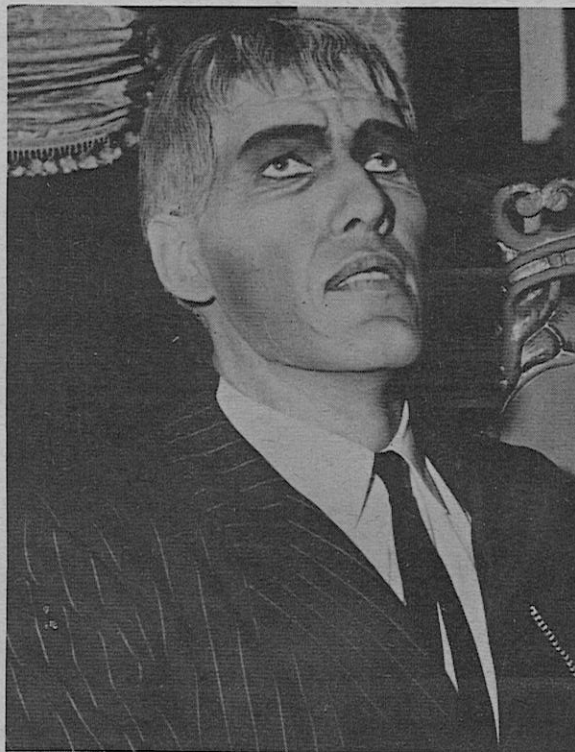

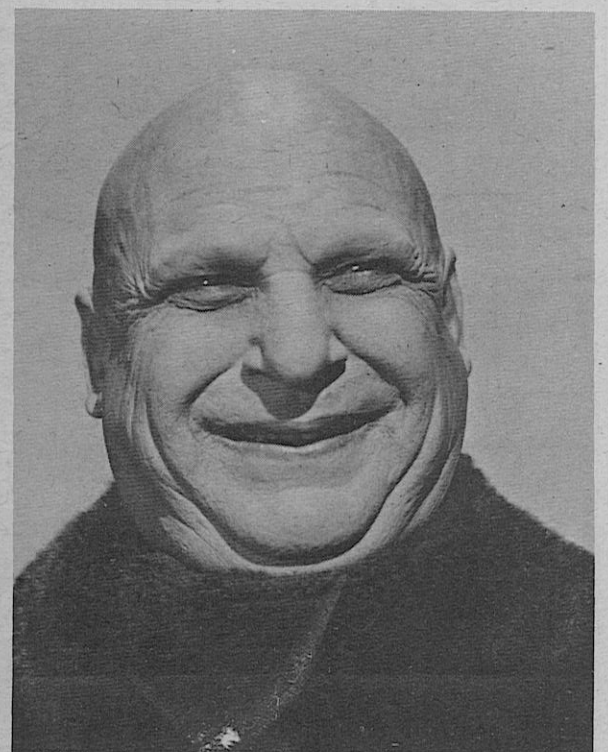

**THIRTEEN QUESTIONS ABOUT THE MASONS**  
(Continued)

Question 10: - How active is the average Mason in his lodge? Here Mr. Whalen hits our weak spot. Unfortunately, all too many Masons are 'pin wearers' only. But many, many Masons who rarely visit lodge are proud of their Masonic association, and even more proud of the great charitable projects conducted by the various Masonic and related bodies. The remarkable thing is the considerable number of Masons who give of their time and their talents to Masonry.

Question 11: - How can anyone find out about the secret rituals of the lodge? The 'secrets' of Masonry are very, very few, consisting of a few grips and passwords, and the ritual language used in conferring its degrees. The real values of Masonry are contained in its great principles, in its moral and ethical teachings. These have been printed in hundreds of books and pamphlets, which anyone may purchase. Many of them may be borrowed from the Public Library.

Question 12: - Have most presidents of the United States been Masons? Mr. Whalen states, 'despite Masonic boasts, only thirteen of the nation's thirty-five presidents' have been Masons. This is one claim that I have never encountered in any Masonic writing. The following presidents were members of the fraternity: Washington, Monroe (E.A.), Jackson, Polk, Buchanan, Andrew Johnson, Garfield, McKinley, Theodore Roosevelt, Taft, Harding, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Truman, Lyndon B. Johnson (E.A.). This makes a total of 14 out of 36, or about 40%. Masonic membership is about 4 million out of about 200 million, or 2%. Not bad, we think.

Question 13: - Is the Shrine the highest Masonic degree? The Shrine is not a 'degree,' but an organization of Masons which has as its requirement that at applicant for membership must be a 32nd degree Mason in the Scottish Rite, or a Knights Templar in the York Rite. It is often called 'the playground of Masonry' because it is dedicated to fun and fellowship. But the Shrine maintains and supports one of the greatest charitable projects in the world, - 19 Hospitals for Crippled Children, and 3 Burns Hospitals for badly-burned children, where treatment is given only to children from families who cannot afford to pay. Treatment is given to such children, regardless of race, creed, or color, and at not one penny of cost to the parents, and without support or subsidy from the government. Masons take great pride in this great philanthropy, and in the humanitarian projects which each Masonic Body maintains and supports.

In one of his poems, Robert Frost said --  
"I don't believe the sleepers in this house  
Know where they are  
And I begin to fear they never will."

How true this is of many men in Masonry. As we enter into this new year there is so much to be done and it is the responsibility of you and I to get about the work at hand.

To know where we are it is important that we clearly understand where, when and why we entered Masonry, and this means all of us have to learn more about being a Mason. Only by a thorough knowledge of our beliefs and tenets, our history and landmarks, our ritual and its beautiful moral lessons, and the hopes and accomplishments of our charities can we really know ourselves as Masons.

Masonry has stood upon the threshold of greatness for many years but something has held us back. Too many young Masons (young in their Masonic life) have never found the true Masonic spirit, they haven't seen the vision of greatness available to us as Masons. They have become mired down in mediocrity, entangled in secondary objectives and completely engulfed in materialistic values. They haven't been brought into Masonry with an opportunity to give of themselves and to offer and suggest what might be added light.

The age old problem of membership and attendance are created and perpetuated by us. If all of us shifted our attention from an inward glance and looked out upon Masonry with concern and appreciation, we could all find peace, love, greatness, and at the same time solve many of the problems facing Masonry today.

Let us give of ourselves and recreate our faith in Masonry and our belief that glorious days do lie ahead for our great Fraternity. Let us support our charities for the future benefit of all mankind. Let us live our lives according to our Masonic beliefs. In so doing, we will know where we are and the others will be left to sleep.

Dear Brethren:

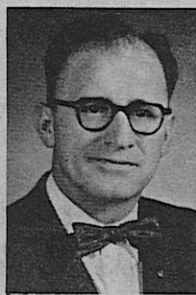
