## FIRST RESPONSE INDICATES SUCCESS FOR 1967 BROTHERHOOD FUND DRIVE

The first return envelopes received this week at the Masonic Temple give promise by their numbers that the 1967 Masonic Brotherhood Fund Drive in Monroe Districts 30 and 31 will top the 1966 fund raising effort both in total dollars contributed and in percentage of brothers taking part.

"This confirms what we hoped for this year", says Bennett Taylor, District Chairman with Fred Belluscio for the Monroe County drive. "That our new type of campaign, concentrated within a short period with a real effort expended to show our brothers the great need for their support, will demonstrate that Masons respond generously when they understand the need and know what their support helps to accomplish."

The initial response to the Annual Drive supporting the Masonic Home and

Masonic Research Center in Utica was triggered by the first of two schedule mailings in this year's effort. Members of the fraternity in the Rochester area received their first mailed appeal January 12 and 13. Processed for mailing by Brotherhood Fund Chairmen from 15 individual lodges, assisted by members of the Fidelity Triangle Club and DeMolay, the mailing consisted of a brochure and a special return envelope. The brochure, designed and produced by Brothers Emery Carey and Stuart Rice features a presentation of the Masonic brothers and widows from Monroe County in residence at the Home in Utica.

Receiving their Brotherhood Fund mailings late in the week, many Monroe Masons mailed their contribution checks over the weekend.

Last year, the first for the new type of campaign, the Monroe's Fund Drive Committee was cheered to find the response during the first three weeks exceeded 25% of the total for the entire year in 1965.

"This certainly proves our new short term drive with the mailings followed by the every member canvas by the lodge chairmen in 1966 built up a momentum that's giving us a head start this year," continued Belluscio. "It looks like the chairmen this year are going to have fewer members of their lodges to call individually."

**SECOND MAILING AND PERSONAL CONTACTS TO CLOSE DRIVE**

A follow-up mailing will be released about February 20th to all members not yet responding. Names of those who respond initially will be removed from the second mailing list. "A few men who have forwarded their donations will no doubt get a second mailing," says George Wetzel, committee member in charge of mailings, "But I'm sure they'll realize it takes time to process their donations to make sure their lodges get due credit and they'll disregard the follow-up."

Final phase of the campaign, scheduled to close in March, will be the calls from Blue Lodge Brotherhood Committee members to their members not yet responding.



**Dear Brother Herman**

**Q.** We have a candidate who has been initiated and passed, but has never come forward to receive the Third Degree. We understand that he is no longer interested. Must we carry him indefinitely, or can we unaffiliate him, or expel him, or how do we get rid of him?

**A.** A candidate who has been duly elected becomes a Mason when he is initiated Entered Apprentice. He does not become a member of the Lodge, however, until he has received the Third Degree and signed the by-laws.

An Entered Apprentice or a Fellowcraft is a candidate, pure and simple. While it has been ruled that he may be present in the Lodge where he received the E.A. and/or F.C. Degree, when the degree is being worked, he has no right to visit any other Lodge when the particular degree is being worked.

Beyond that, he has no other Masonic rights, such as the right of dimit, the right to Masonic Funeral, (though the Master of the Lodge may conduct a Funeral Service for an E.A. or a F.C., at his discretion, if requested), and no right to refund of a portion of the initiation fee, (since the fee is for conferring the First Degree).

When an E.A. or F.C. refuses advancement, the Secretary should remove his name from the current list of candidates awaiting degrees, and merely leave a space in the Book of By-laws, bearing the Lodge number assigned to him at initiation and reported to Grand Lodge on the Annual Return. The Historical Register, under the same number, will list the date or dates of the preliminary degrees. A note can be added that the Third Degree was not conferred.

Incidentally, there is no time limit in our Grand Jurisdiction. The candidate may present himself 5, 10, 20 or even 50 years later (if not senile), prove his proficiency, and receive the remaining degree or degrees.

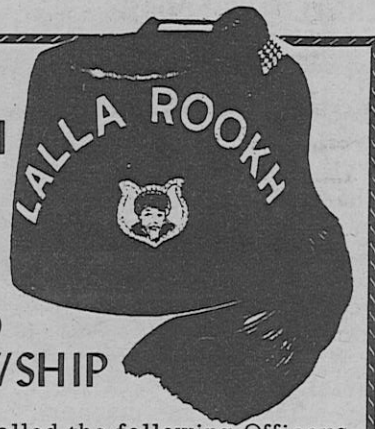

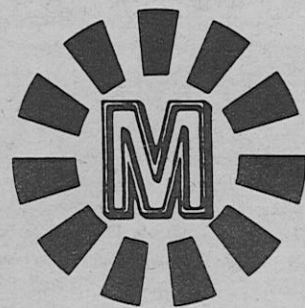

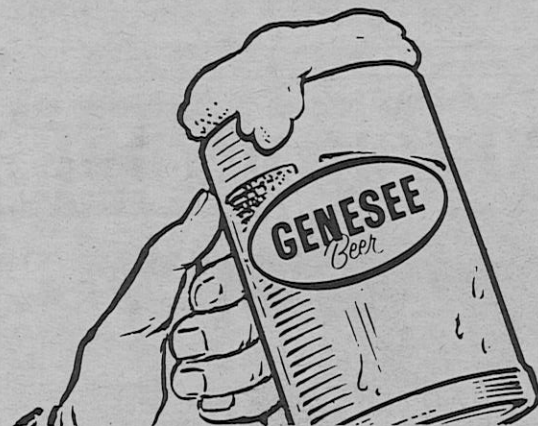
