#### MONROE DISTRICTS BROTHERHOOD **FUND REPORTS**

In the initial report of the 1972-73 Brotherhood Fund Campaign, R:W: George C. Dietel, State Chairman, informs us that the Advance Phase of the present Campaign has resulted in donations of approximately \$73,300 from 4600 plus contributors. This puts us \$21,300 behind last year's report for the same period from June 10 through November 30. With the State goal of \$1,400,000 for the current compaign, this means we have our work cut out for us.





#### **Dear Brother Herman**

Rt. Wor. Herman Sarachan will answer questions on Masonic ritual, symbolism, history and law. Address your questions to BROTHER HERMAN, % Masonic Service Bureau, 875 Main Street East, Rochester, New York 14605.

Our Past Masters say that only a Past Master can deliver a charge. Do I remember that you said differently at the School?

First, let us state once again that no lodge may be opened unless the Master or one of the Wardens is present (Const. 310). In their absence, no Past Master or group of Past Masters may open the Lodge.

In case of emergency, if all three become incapacitated. or remove from the city, the Grand Master may appoint a delegate of his choice to convene and open the Lodge,

and preside therein. (Handbook, Section 630)

With the Master or one of the Wardens present, any station or place may be filled, and any portion of the work exemplified by any Master Mason at the will of the presiding officer, such Master Mason need not be a member of the particular lodge. (Handbook, Section 641). A bylaw which restricts any portion of the work to a present or Past Master is void. (Handbook, Section 642).

The exceptions are: the investiture ceremony of a Mas-

ter elect, which can only be performed by a Past Master, and the installation of officers, which must be performed by an actual Master or Past Master, who may not delegate the installation of one or more officers to another, not a Past Master (Handbook, Section 916).

To answer your question, the charges, as well, as all other portions of the work may be performed by and competent brother at the will of the presiding officer.

One of our members who was unaffiliated some years ago desires to clear himself as he wishes to affiliate in his new location. Must we restore him to membership before granting a demit? Do we charge him dues for the current year?

A brother who has been unaffiliated may clear his record at anytime in the future by paying to the Lodge the amount owing at the time of unaffiliation. No other fees may be imposed. The Lodge must issue a certificate stating that the brother is clear on the books. (Handbook, Section 758) Suggested form of the certificate (Handbook, Section 759), which may be secured from the Grand Secretary's office.

Should the brother request that he be restored to membership in his original lodge, if within five years of unaffiliation, the vote is by majority, by show of hands. If after five years, the vote must be by ballot and must be unanimous. The brother may then be charged with the current year's dues. (Handbook, Sections 820, 821, 824, 825, 829).

## CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

#### WHICH WAY ARE YOU GOING?

Many years ago, I heard the story of a boy, who, during an extended illness covering three months with a number of relapses, had a very vivid dream which he has never forgotten. He was on an excellent racing sled going down hill very fast. As he continued on down, he realized that some who had passed him earlier, now were going back up—others were not returning. Somehow he decided he did not want to go all the way down, and with great effort, managed to stop and placed the sled pointing up-

It was necessary to make three starts before he fin-ally reached the top. When he awakened he believed the three starts back may have represented his three relapses, and the many who did not return, were those who had been claimed by an epidemic of a contagious disease sweeping the city where he lived.

Elijah lived in the reign of Ahab who displaced belief in God with Baal worship as the official faith of the Israel nation. Elijah became a religious refugee for most of his life here on earth. I Kings 18 we find him outnumbered 400 to 1, by the priests of Baal when he challenged them to a test of whose god was supreme.

Each was to prepare a sacrifice and call upon his deity to ignite the flame beneath. It is a well known story, the 400 spent a fruitless day, Elijah thoroughly wet down everything around his offering and when he sought God's help, the flames consumed everything. Religion among the Children of Israel started uphill for they turned and smote the 400 false priests, killing all!

The 19th Chapter of Luke, relates the story of the publican, Zaccheus, who was truly an outcast because he was employed by the Roman government. He wanted to see Jesus, but being short of stature, climbed a tree on the road thro'. which he was to pass. The great Teacher lacked in an angle to that place and said "Zacchaeus" the road thro'. which he was to pass. The great Teacher looked up as He came to that place and said "Zacchaeus come down for today, I must abide at your house" Later upon arrival at the man's home "Today is salvation come to this house for asmuch as he is also a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save that which was lost" That day was indeed a complete turn about for Zacchaeus, he too, started uphill.

Almost a century and a half ago there was an incident in our fraternity which might have seriously crippled indeed destroyed our brotherhood. There was an immense

deed destroyed our brotherhood. There was an immense setback but in time men who had a real faith, were able to start anew and those who had faith, found they were

If we are deeply involved in fraternal or religious groups which we sense are sliding down hill, we need to turn to the Divine Architect of all eternity who alone can light and guide us back up to the summit.
