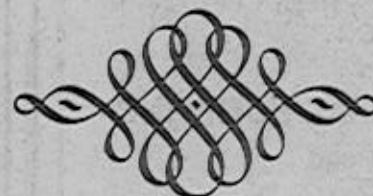

Recently a brother, let's call him Brother W. stated that he thought that the Government should pay for the restoration. In all good conscience I could not agree with that concept.

Over 125 years ago the idea of the Statue of Liberty was given birth by French patriots, including two grandsons of General Lafayette. Funding of this giant project was done strictly through contributions freely given by the French people (not their government). Then to support the statue a pedestal was needed. This cost was borne by contributions of America's school children.

With this kind of popular support and backing it would seem inappropriate to get the Federal Government involved in the current project.

Suppose the current con-

tributions had been sent to Washington, D.C. with the instructions that the money so collected had to be used to renovate the Statue of Liberty. I think you know the answer to that. By the time the money filtered the bureaucratic offices, channels, and red tape a \$100 contribution would probably end up as a \$60 payment to the workmen. Add to this the penchant to form many committees, the government would also take 2 or 3 years longer to get the job done.

Brother W. in many things I know you are right, however in this situation I think the efforts of individuals speak louder and more effectively than government. To paraphrase Pogo, "We have met the Government, and they is us."





## Our Wisdom And Counsel Called Home To God

Brethren:

My heart isn't into writing the column this month...I've lost a friend! A lot of the joy of belonging to John A. Robertson Lodge departed in March, called home by the Supreme Architect of the Universe.

Worshipful Brother Merl W. Nulton was, in my opinion, the very core of the Lodge. No other single person did so much to ensure that the Lodge would operate efficiently and function properly.

Fifteen years ago when I was first appointed to line, Merl was firmly entrenched as our Secretary. Young and enthusiastic, the Officers would meet and plan Lodge activities. W.B. Merl was there to see that everything was in order with Grand Lodge requirements, and to give his wisdom and counsel as only one who has been there and had the experiences can do.

Merl had opinions, and was not afraid to voice them. Sometimes the Lodge Brothers did not agree with him. While this may have been unpleasant to his pallette, he would dutifully record the wishes of the majority and execute the designs placed upon the trestleboard.

As I progressed up the Line, I had to deal more and more with him. As Master in 1976, I looked to him constantly for guidance. I'm not too sure what his honest opinion was of some of my ideas, but I never recall him berating me for my efforts nor implying that anything was dumb or silly. He would answer my questions as if they were the first time he had heard them, although each Master had probably asked the same thing for the past dozen years and he was tired of hearing it asked

Merl could appreciate my point of view, but still encouraged me to be positive and not let my personal feelings become a negative influence on our membership.

The light is out now. He has preceded us to the House not made with hands, where Marjorie has been waiting. Our greatest tribute to him could only be to work even harder to maintain that which he endeavored to sustain during his earthly labors. Peace, Merl.
