## TEMPLE TRUSTEES NEWS

### Offer Made to Purchase Auditorium

The first order of business at the November meeting was a presentation by John Judd from Valley Lodge who spoke on the potential of selling the Masonic Temple to a charitable trust. It was taken under advisement and referred to an appropriate committee for consideration.

Letters were received as follows:

1. Two from Valley Lodge about the sale of the Temple.
2. One from the Organ Society about the sale of the Temple.
3. Two from William Staples about a formal appraisal.
4. One from Damascus Temple concerning their 1984 assessment.

The executive committee recommended that the decision regarding the sale of the Temple to the church group be held in

abeyance for six months.

A motion was made to empower the president to sign a sale with the church group and it was defeated 9-6

A second motion was made based on the recommendation of the committee, and it passed 10-4.

A motion to extend the time of the delinquent members to December 31, 1985 was passed 10-4. If they do not pay their 1984 assessments, they will forfeit their member status.

It was reported that all of the questionnaires on long range housing had not been received.

A Committee was appointed to investigate all potential sale, lease, or rental propositions.

The executive committee will recommend that we will renew the manager's contract for one year, that a letter received from Seneca Lodge be referred to an appropriate committee, and that a letter from a theater group offering to purchase the auditorium be referred to committee and seriously considered.

Finally, a letter was received from Damascus Temple that they are removing themselves from the Temple by December 31, 1985.

Their potentate stated that they knew what their responsibilities were and would fulfill them.

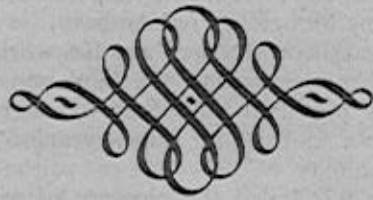

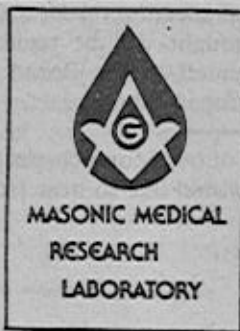

### DR. MASSIE SPEAKS AT SYMPOSIUM



Dr. Harold Massie, research scientist in the aging program at the Masonic Medical Research Laboratory, was an invited speaker to the celebration in honor of Professor Paul Doty on the occasion of his 65th birthday. The meeting was held at the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, on the campus of Harvard University in Cambridge, MA from May 30 to June 2, 1985. Both an arms control and scientific symposium were presented. The reason for this was that although Paul Doty is known as a distinguished biochemist he is also the founder and head of the Center for Science in International Affairs at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard. Thus, while most of the more than a hundred participants were scientists; lawyers, economists, engineers, psychologists and corporate executives also attended.

The first speaker was the former ambassador to India, John Kenneth Galbraith and the last was Paul Doty. A total of 14 speakers described Paul Doty's experiences in the area of arms control and the prevention of nuclear war. A total of 11 speakers presented scientific seminars concerning polymer chemistry, physical chemistry, polypeptides, polynucleotides, biochemistry and molecular biology. The Masonic Medical Research Laboratory was represented by Harold Massie's talk on "Metal ion accumulation and aging". Dr. Massie said "It was a gratifying experience to honor a man who has devoted his life to improving the health of mankind and to preventing the tragedy of a thermonuclear war. Paul Doty is one of those rare persons among us whom we admire not so much for the person he is but for the values he represents. He is a true humanitarian".

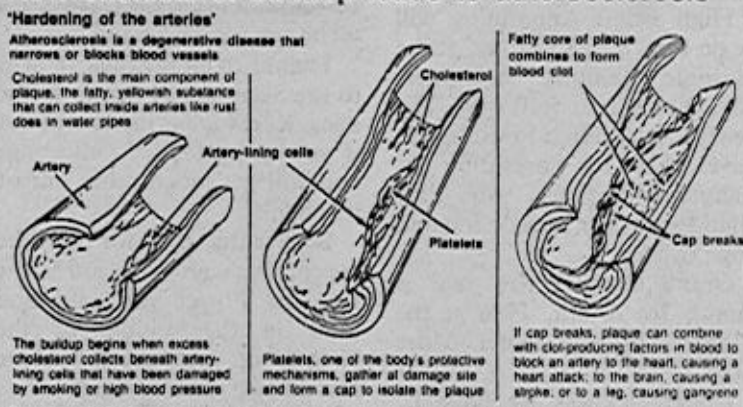
# ARTIFICIAL BLOOD USED IN TREATING ATHEROSCLEROSIS

A blood substitute, Fluosol, is making treatment of atherosclerosis safer and more effective. According to some doctors, the use of artificial blood could be useful in treating cancers that don't respond to current therapy.

Because of the oxygen transport capabilities of blood substitutes thousands of Americans who undergo angioplasty have less chance of damage to their heart during surgery. This property also increases the amount of time surgeons can safely perform the procedure.

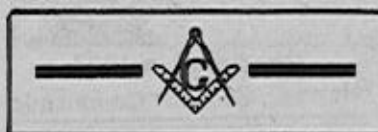
Angioplasty begins with the insertion of a long balloon-tipped catheter into an artery near the groin. It is then pushed up to the coronary artery that is blocked by cholesterol and plaque. The balloon is greatly inflated for one or two minutes flattening the plaque and widening the artery to allow for normal blood flow. If this technique is accepted in the medical community at least one-half of all blood supplied could be saved for other uses.
