Grand Master To Be Present for Distinguished Community Service Award At Inter-Faith Breakfast



The 1986 Recipient of the Masonic Service Bureau's Distinguished Community Service Award is R.: W.: R. Kenneth Crawford. This award will be presented on Sunday, November 2 at the breakfast following the Interfaith Service at the Masonic Temple, 875 East Main St.

R.:W.: Brother Crawford is certainly no stranger to Monroe County Masons, having served the Craft for forty years. He was raised in Zetland Lodge No. 951 in 1946 and served as Master in 1959. He is also a member of Hamilton Chapter No. 62, R.A.M.; Doric Council No. 19, R.E.S.M.; Monroe Commandery No. 12, K.T.; Rochester Forest No. 133, Tall Cedars of Lebanon; AASR, Valley of Rochester; Damascus Temple, AAONMS; Royal Order of Scotland; St. Mark's Conclave, Knights of the Red Cross of Constantine; Royal Order of Jesters; American Lodge of Research and the Purple Club of the Monroe Districts. R.: W.: Brother Crawford has served in various capacities in many of these organizations including as Thrice Potent Master of Rochester Lodge of Perfection and Sovereign Prince of the Rochester Council, Princes of Jerusalem. He has also served as a President of the Bureau of Masonic Education, a DeMolay Board Member, President of the Masonic Service Bureau, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the TCC Boad of Trustees. President of the Shrine Past Masters Degree Team, Director of the Past Masters Super Club and a member of the Shrine Greeters. In 1985 he was awarded the DeMolay Legion of Honor. R.:W.: Brother Crawford was coronetted an Honorary Thirty Third Degree Mason in Boston in 1969 by the AASR, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction. 
Later the group witnesses the "Pass-ing Out" Parade of over 2000 cadets. Fantastic. It brought a lump to our



### Cammeron Cox Appointed to Steward Chair

Dear Brothers:

As many of you know who were in attendance at our October informational meeting, as well as our regular communication on October 21st, our Lodge must make some critical decisions primarily centered on finances. The continuing decline in membership in our Masonic Fraternity has increased the responsibility of each one of us to underwrite and maintain our masonic programs. Even our own Lodge, which has enjoyed some success in attracting new, brothers, has seen its membership drop from 431 to 3/0 since 1980.

Although the officers and members of Seneca Lodge #797 are committed to reversing that trend and to search out ways to ease the financial strain, our immediate need is to balance our budget for the 1986/87 fiscal year (a summary of which is enclosed in the trestleboard). The cost of our housing continues to create the primary pressure on our budget, now accounting for 43 % of our ex-

penditures. Until we are able to resolve our housing crisis, we see little alternative but to ask you to approve an increase in your dues for the Lodge from \$23.00 per annum to \$35.00 per annum. With the increase and assessment of \$5.00 from Grand Lodge for Grand Lodge dues, our total dues package for the 1986/87 fiscal year would be \$70.

You should know how much I and the officers and trustees of your Lodge have appreciated the support and assistance so many of you have given while we continue to seek out long term solutions to the challenges we face within our Masonic Fraternity. You may be assured that we will do our best to be deserving of the trust you have reposed in us.

I would also invite you to be with us and share in the raising of several new brothers and welcoming them into our Fraternity as Master Masons at our November communication. So often it is these initial experiences that form lasting impressions. Let us all work toward making those initial experiences positive ones. Your presence and support is only one of the key ways we can begin to reverse the trend under which we have labored for so long.

Finally, I take great pleasure in announcing the appointment of Brother Cammeron Cox to one of our Stewards chairs. The enthusiasm Brother Cox brings to his new appointment is yet another example of the fresh energy infusing our lodge and why many of us have such a positive feeling concerning the future of our fraternity.
