The Masonic Development Course is offered in a series of three courses,



each following the Masonic Degrees; Entered Apprentice degree, Fellowcraft degree and the Master Mason degree; each degree providing a different and unique experience to the brother. The Masonic Development Courses answer and explain the experiences of each degree.

As many of you already know, the Road To The East (RTTE) training course provides some of the information and tools necessary to successfully run a Lodge. This training covers Masonic Law of New York, Grand Lodge structure and operations, Constitutions and more. The training is meant for any and all Masons but


primarily for those aspiring to advance to a seat in the East. This training will take place during the winter months. This training will most likely be in February. More on this to follow.

-Please keep watch for the 3rd and 4th schools to be announced!


